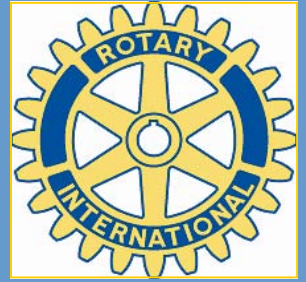

NEW WORK HABITS FOR A RADICALLY CHANGING WORLD
